This document contains key information you should know about Class F (USD) units of the NewGen Alternative Income Fund (the "Fund"). You can find more details in the Fund's simplified prospectus. Before you invest in any fund, consider how the fund would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

This Fund is an alternative mutual fund. It invests in asset classes and/or uses investment strategies that are not permitted for conventional mutual funds. The specific strategies that differentiate this Fund from conventional mutual funds include increased use of derivatives for hedging and non-hedging purposes; increased ability to sell securities short; and the ability to borrow cash to use for investment purposes. While these strategies will be used in accordance with the Fund's investment objective and strategies, during certain market conditions they may accelerate the pace at which your investment decreases in value.

What does the fund invest in?


The Fund seeks to provide unitholders with a combination of steady long-term capital appreciation and a stable stream of income. To achieve this investment objective, the Fund invests both long and short in an actively managed diversified portfolio of predominantly Canadian securities, with the balance being traded on globally recognized stock exchanges. The portfolio is comprised of equities, convertible debentures, fixed income, preferred shares, SPACs, options, and warrants. The Manager places a strong emphasis on risk management and defensive market positioning in order to reduce beta (i.e., systemic risk) and preserve capital in adverse market conditions. The Fund employs a broad range of alternative investment strategies including fundamental long / short, opportunistic long / short, pairs trading, hedging and option strategies.

Through the use of cash borrowing, short selling, or specified derivatives, the Fund's aggregate leverage will not exceed 300% of the fund's net asset value or as otherwise as permitted under applicable securities legislation. The leverage is calculated in accordance with the methodology prescribed by securities regulations, or any exemptions therefrom.

The charts below give a snapshot of the Fund's investments on December 31, 2024. The Fund's investments will change.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a Fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

NewGen has rated the volatility of this Fund as Low to Medium.

This rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how Class F (USD) units of the Fund have performed since its inception. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how the Class F (USD) units of the Fund have performed This table shows the best and worst returns for Class F (USD) units of the over its three full calendar years of existence. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in Class F (USD) units of the Fund since its inception now has \$1,299.56. This works out to an annual compound return of 6.92%.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- Plan to invest for the medium-term or longer-term as part of a balanced portfolio
- Want access to research-driven investing
- Want to gain exposure to a diversified portfolio of securities,
- Are comfortable with a low-medium risk level.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirements Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund outside a registered plan, fund distributions are included in your income for tax purposes, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does this cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Class F (USD) units of the Fund.

The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among classes of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

No sales charges apply when you purchase Class F (USD) units of the Fund.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

As at June 30, 2024, Class F (USD) units of the Fund's expenses were 4.73% of its value, which equals \$47.30 for every \$1,000 invested.

The Fund pays the Manager an annual performance fee equal to 15% of the amount by which the total return of the Class F (USD) units of the Fund exceeds the all-time "highwater mark" for the Class. The total return is calculated after accounting for all other expenses of the Fund.

More about the trailing commission

There is no trailing commission payable by NewGen in respect of Class F (USD) units of the Fund.

3. Other Fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or redesignate units of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Investment advisory fee	Class F (USD) Units of the fund are only available to investors who have a fee-based account with their representative's firm and whose representative's firm has signed an agreement with NewGen. You pay a fee to your representative's firm for investment advice and other services
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2.00% of the value of units you sell within 90 days of buying them. This fee goes to the Fund.
Redesignation fee	Up to 2.00% of the value of the units you redesignate. This fee goes to your representative.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase order within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
